



(Established under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956 vide Notification No. F.9-5/84-U-3 Dated 12 January 1987 of the Government India)

With the awakening of national consciousness in the early years of the last century, a few notable efforts were made in British India to improve the system of education prevalent in India during that time. Gujarat Vidyapeeth, started by Mahamatma Gandhi, aimed at preparing youth to serve and uplift the rural masses; Shantiniketan tried to bring the cultures of the East and West into universal harmony; Jamia Milia tried to educate the Muslims in leading with the needs of the main stream of national wide and the Gurukul Change aimed at preserving the cultural heritage of the nation keeping with the requirements of the modern age. ABOUT PHYSIOTHERAPY

Physiotherapy has its origin in ancient times with advent of manipulation and massage in China circa 3000 BC. Hippocrates in 460 BC Described Massage and Hydrotherapy. Physiotherapy grew rapidly after Second World War with spinal injury units, orthopaedics hospitals and chest clinics providing new challenges to the profession. Major conditions managed by physiotherapists can be grouped into 4 categories :

1. Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy : Various modalities including stretching, endurance manual techniques, soft tissue therapy, cryotherapy, heat therapy are available & it also deals with sports injuries.
2. Cardiopulmonary Physiotherapy : Physiotherapy treat acute problems like asthma, acute chest infection trauma, chronic condition like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), cystic fibrosis, post myocardial infarction (MI) pneumonia & dealing in ICU and ICCU.
3. Neurological Physiotherapy : Treatment of neurological condition that is based on exercises to restore sensory motor function and improve motor patterns, coordination of movements and to provide & Improve good quality of life.
4. Integumentary Physiotherapy : Treatment of conditions involving skin and related organs including debridement of wound, burns, dressing, scar prevention and reduction along with lymphoderma Physiotherapist has clinical independence.
5. Relevance of Physiotherapy in Modern Era : Physiotherapy plays a significant role in modern era, there are increased health problems due to sedentary life style and environmental condition.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Fees Rules

- Fees once paid will not be refundable under any circumstances and is subject to modification.
- Hostel caution money is refundable 6 months after leaving hostel accommodation and submission of no dues certificate and original receipt.
- Each student shall pay examination fee for the University Examination as prescribed by the University.
- In case of discontinuation / transfer the student shall deposit the complete fee of the entire course, otherwise college / university will neither issue the NOC nor refund the caution money.
- Failure to pay the term fees before the stipulated date shall invite penalty.
- In addition to the prescribed fees each student have to pay examination and other fees of the University.
- There will be no changes in fees once deposited.
- If student doing MPT research work or BPT Internship from outside the department fee will be paid by student.

Department Hours: The normal department hours, unless otherwise announced by the principal, extend a week day from 9.30 A.M. to 3.30 P.M. The department will be closed on Sunday and Govt. Holidays.

Attendance : A minimum of 75% attendance is required in all subject separately (Lectures & Practical) for examination if his or her attendance falls below this percentage, student will be discarded from the examination

It is compulsory to appear in Pre-University Examination conducted by Dept. to become eligible for University Examination Practical files shall be completed with the completion of that particular Practical / Visit.

Conveyance: We have two department bus facility for students & staff.

General Rules

- (a) Student must regularly attend the classes according to the scheduled time. A minimum of 75% attendance in each subject is compulsory, otherwise the student shall not be allowed to appear in the examination. In the rest 25% (out of 100%) consideration for medical, sports etc. is included.
- (b) Only authorized users/students are allowed to enter the college premises. So all users/student are required to carry their identity card issued by the college always with them and are required to show it on demand.
- (c) A student who misbehaves and does not follow the instructions of Teacher will be recorded in the personal file of the student and disciplinary action will be taken against him / her. The Principal is empowered to refuse admission, if the student is found acting in a manner causing interruption to the smooth running of the college.
- (d) No candidate shall be allowed for un-intimated long leave except the college declared vacations. Otherwise his/her name may be strikes off and admission cancelled.
- (e) Any change in the postal / permanent address of the student shall be informed in the college in writing, otherwise the college will not be responsible for any communication gap / loss etc.
- (f) Smoking, Tobacco chewing and use of alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited in all parts of the college, hospital campus and hostel.
- (g) Use of Mobile / Cell phones is strictly prohibited during College / Duty hours.
- (h) No Society, Union or Association of the student shall be formed in the college and no outsider, invited

to address a meeting without the Principal's specific permission.

- (i) In the college debates and other meetings, the chair must be taken by a responsible person approved previously by the Principal and the subject of the debate must have been approved by the Principal.
- (j) In all matters, whether covered or not in the existing rules, the decision of the Management shall be final.
- (k) The Management reserves the rights of making any addition to or deletion from or alteration in the above rules and regulation including the structure without prior notice. Interpretation given by the Management regarding the details of this prospectus will be final.
- (l) For all legal matters / disputes arising out of provisions of this prospectus the court of Jurisdiction will be that of Udaipur only.

Library Rules

- 1 Students and teaching staff of the college are entitled to use the library.
- 2 The teachers may for some time retain books that are necessary for purpose of their reference. The reference book may be lend for a week to members of the teaching staff.
- 3 Reference books shall not be issued to the students.
- 4 The library will remain open on all working days.
- 5 All books taken on loan should be produced to the librarian while issuing or re-issuing any book.
- 6 Books issued to the student shall not be retained for more than 10 days from the date of issue a penalty of Rs.1/- per day will be charged up to 14 days and thereafter penalty will be Rs.5/- per day. If the due date happens to be a holiday the books must be refunded on the next working days.
- 7 A book may be recalled at any time even if the period of loans has not expired. The books may be reissued to the same borrower if he or she so desires after producing the valid purpose for it.
- 8 Failure to pay the library fine due to return the books within due date the student is liable for withdrawal of his/her privilege to borrow any more books from the library till the overdue books are returned and dues cleared.
- 9 The making of books with ink or pencil, causing damage to bindings, the underlining of passages, the writing or remarks in illustration, tearing of pages, picture etc. are absolutely forbidden.
- 10 If any book is lost, damaged, the borrower shall be required to replace the book with the fine or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the principal.
11. If any book belonging to a set or series, is lost or damaged and a new volume is not separately available, the new borrower shall be required to replace the whole set or series, the defected or damaged books, set or series will be given to the borrower after its replacement.
12. Before leaving the counter, borrowers shall examine the books taken and point out any damage or defect in any books to the librarian and have these defects etc. noted by him otherwise the borrowers will be held responsible for any damage of mutilation observed at the time return.
- 13 Strict silence is to be observed in the library.

White apron is compulsory for all students throughout the course period. A students whose Uniform / dress is untidy may be refused admission to the class.
